BC Becomes First Province to Deploy Hybrid CNG Technology to Transport Recyclables

Return-It is taking the next step in creating a greener beverage container recycling system in B.C. by introducing Canada's first-of-its-kind compressed natural gas (CNG) hybrid-electric compaction truck.

In a pilot project launching this month, Return-It is beginning the decarbonization of its transportation fleet, which could reduce greenhouse gas emissions from beverage container recycling by up to 25% and reduce the number of transport vehicles on the road.

COVID-19 restrictions were eased and what that means for future


electricity demand in B.C." finds about 40 per cent of British Columbians
