Ontario will be receiving an \$8.4 billion subsidy – the result of a transfer of a share of renewable generation costs to the provincial tax base. The Financial Accountability Office (FAO) of Ontario released a report that shows an \$118 billion dollar investment by the province towards nine provincial energy subsidy

programs for the 2020-21 to 2039-40 period. The largest portion of that will be put used towards the Ontario Electricity Rebate (OER) for residential, small business and farm customers.
